Germany

In Germany more 188 GMO-free areas and initiatives have been set up by an alliance of 29 405 organic and conventional farmers. 185 municipalities do not allow the cultivation of GMOs on their land.

In the end of July 2010, 198 gmo-free-regions, 235 gmo-free-municipalities and 1.158 gmo-free-farms, i.e. 1.074.409 ha (2.655.114 acres), were declared in Germany.

All 54 Greek prefectures have voted to declare their area GMO-free, making Greece the first country (of now three) to be entirely covered by GMO-free areas.

Since 2005, there are two GMO-free regions: Southern Transdanubia and Western Transdanubia.

76 municipalities have committed themselves to:

1. Declare the municipality a GMO-free zone
2. Follow a GMO-free policy in the services provided by the municipality
3. Enhance and support GMO-free agriculture with all the possible ways
4. Follow the new proposals for the authorization of new GMOs, and when consider it necessary will inform the GenTech Committee that the municipality would want to be excluded from the scope of the authorization;
5. Control the cultivation of GM plants in the locally protected areas.

1 county: The motion written by a local politician, Bogna Wojtkiewicz Adolfsson (Centre party), to make Jämtland County GMO-free was approved by Jämtland County Council, on April 22, 2009:

The entire Swedish dairy industry remains GMO-free, with no GM feed being used throughout.

7 Municipalities: The first GMO free municipality in Sweden was Östersund in 2008, then in 2009 the municipality of Åre declared itself GMO-free. Now there are five more: Krokoms kommun, Borlänge kommun, Uddevalla kommun, Kalmar kommun, Kumla kommun

Switzerland

Switzerland has a 5-year moratorium against the commercial cultivation of GM crops and animals. In a referendum the majority of the Swiss population (55.7%) and all cantons voted in November 2005, to prohibit the use of genetically modified animals and plants in Swiss agriculture for a period of five years. In March 2010 Swiss Parliament has extended its ban on the cultivation of genetically modified plants for another three years until November 2013.

Three cantons and two regions banned the commercial release of GMOs: Canton Ticino, Canton Jura-North Vaudois, Canton Appenzell (in woodland areas), region Oberes Suhrental (AG) and region Wägital
