## Important Momentum

- ⇒ food crisis
- ⇒ climate crisis
- ⇒ financial and economic crisis

Nothing really new, but higher public attention on issues

- => FAO, G8, High Level Task Force etc.
  - => e.g. debate and two initiatives for food sovereignty at Swiss parliament; global video conference at European Parliament



### **Promising Initiatives**

- ⇒ <u>IAASTD</u> (International Assessment of Agricultural Knowledge, Science and Technology for Development)
- ⇒ First steps to bring forward a <u>European</u> network for Food Sovereignty (farmers, NGOs)
- ⇒ Right to Food gaining strength (Report on WTO by the Special Rapporteur)
  - ⇒ several initiatives, processes, reports like Ecofair Trade Dialogue; and others



## GMOfree Movement: a European Success Story

- ⇒ strong movement and networks within Europe (at different levels)
- ⇒ important achievements
- ⇒ farmers, consumers and NGOs brought together
- ⇒ networks on the local levels are linked to the international level



### Learn from each other?

- ⇒ the demand for GMOfree agriculture represents the core of the demand for food sovereignty: democratic control of the food we produce and we eat
- ⇒ what and how could be learnt from the GMOfree movement?
- ⇒ How the different movements, initiatives, networks, processes could strengthen each other?



#### Make use of momentum

- ⇒ make use of international processes and reports - IAASTD
- ⇒ debate on national levels regarding food sovereignty
- ⇒ not loosing international focus and solidarity
