New pressure ...

- Pressure on development countries to introduce GM
 - national and international agrobusiness
 - US government, foundations etc.
 - multilateral agencies
- Food Crisis: new push (including AGRA)



GMfree Territories achieved

- Broad alliances on local, regional and national level (farmers, indigenous communities, consumers, environmental and development NGOs, networks etc.)
- Local markets, fairs, conferences, films (including local languages), seed exchange fairs, blogs, demonstrations, legal cases, dialogue with local and national authorities etc.
- ⇒ 1 GMfree Territory in Colombia, 2 GMfree districts in Costa Rica, 1 in Nicaragua



GM Free India Campaign


- more than 50 organisations join to fight GMOs
- Bt-cotton since 2002, farmers suicides, heavy pressure from corporations
- many GM food crops waiting for approval (field trials), including Bt-eggplant
- Hundreds of GMfree villages
- Now focussing on consumers (Including urban middle class)



- Web Advocacy for consumer awareness and rejection of GM food: I am no labrat
- ⇒20'000 petition letters (in only 11 days) to health minister asking for a GMO ban
- ⇒Dec 2008: health minister made a clear statement against GMOs (now prime minister addressed)
- documentary by a bollywood film maker
- Networks on regional level (including Pakistan and Nepal)
